


“Catherine Elizabeth Braun was born in Helsdorf”

Henry Miller Family Pioneered In Cottonwood Lake Area

Henry E. Miller was born in Scheldalen, Germany, on May 22, 1848. When but a year old, he came to America with his parents. He received his education and grew to manhood in Sandwich, Illinois.

Catherine Elizabeth Braun was born in Helsdorf, Germany, on December 11, 1857. She came to America in 1872.

On April 9, 1874, they were united in marriage at the union church in Sandwich, Ill.

In 1882, with three small children, the Millers moved to South Dakota, settling near Cottonwood Lake. The family and household goods all arrived at their new home about the same time.

The winter from Sandstone was so cold that they had to wear heavy wraps and keep them to their chests when they went out. Here they remained until they built their present home.

When they moved, the son, Edward, was but a year old. The children were used to wear the heavy wraps on cold nights. Often on frosty winter mornings, the top quilts were used to wrap the baby.

Henry Miller was very active in church work. During his life he was honored with many church and township offices.

In later years the Miller family built a frame house. There they had the "New" post office and the "Miller" school for a number of years.


Henry and his wife were of the "settling" and "sojourners" of that description made the Miller home their stopping-off place. No one was ever turned away.

In 1912 the family moved to Rapid. Two sons took over the farm, but their father continued to help them each year until his death on November 3, 1918. Mrs. Miller died in her home on Sixth Street in Rapid on January 12, 1941.

In der Notiz dazu heißt es:

“Katherine Elizabeth Broun was born in Helsdorf, Germany, December 11, 1857, and passed away at her home in Redfield February 13, 1941 at the age of 83 years, 3 months, and 2 days. In 1872, at the age of fifteen she came with her brother Henry to find a home in the new land of opportunity -- America. Coming to Peoria, IL she made her home with relatives for a time.

On April 9, 1876, she was united in marriage with Henry E Miller of Sandwich, IL.

After their marriage, they moved to Pontiac, IL. They came to Dakota Territory in 1884, living all of the time in Spink County. They moved to Redfield in 1912.“

Im Verzeichnis der Getauften von Helstorf ist seit 1850 kein Kind namens Braun zu finden (vorher auch nicht).

Der Herkunftsort des Ehemannes Miller, Sechshelden im Lahn-Dill-Kreis, hilft hier auch nicht weiter. Manchmal haben Leute in der neuen Heimat Amerika untereinander aus einer Region geheiratet, aber auch Leute aus anderen Gegenden.

Helsdorf in Mittelsachsen könnte auch infrage kommen, falls der Schreiber in den USA das Gehörte richtig niedergeschrieben hat.

Schließlich antwortet der Autor des Eintrags von 2003, Götz Krueger, nicht mehr.

Fazit: 1. Genaues weiß man nicht. 2. Genealogieportale müssen genauso hinterfragt werden wie andere Quellen, auch wenn sie zu einer Familie mehr Daten liefern als in diesem Fall.
